About the Directory

The Directory of Youth Justice Services in Ontario offers people working within the Youth Justice System, parents and youth a bilingual online connection to community supports for young people in conflict with the law. The Directory defines youth as those aged 12-17 and lists detailed contact information and eligibility requirements for programs and services geared to this age bracket. These listings are offered in both English and French (when French services are available).

Many of the services listed in the directory are provided by nonprofit, community-based or government organizations that service the public directly. However, the directory also contains some private or commercial organizations that do not duplicate the work of nonprofit, community and government organizations. The directory provides easy access to accurate information updated on an ongoing basis, with changes verified with a spokesperson from each organization or program.

How to get more help using this site

This web site features simple navigation allowing you to find the information you need quickly. To ensure ease of use, this guide offers a detailed explanation of the different parts of the site including the search tool, results listings and individual organization's program and service descriptions. The site's Help section can be used to learn more about searching for programs or locations on the site.

How to find information in the Directory of Services


How to update information online
